

Tours of the 1839 Log Cabin - Concordia Seminary birthplace, the Christiane Loeber Cabin and the 1867 Trinity Church await us.

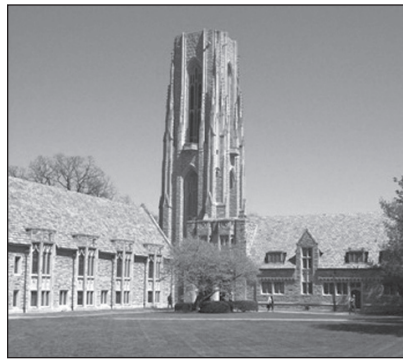

Tuesday, Oct 5/Day 1 North Dakota to St Louis Park, MN

We depart from either Minot or Dickinson picking up passengers along Highway 2 and I-94. **Note:** Two motor coaches will be used. However, if not enough reservations are received, one departure will be used (Minot with pickups in Bismarck and along I-94). Our first overnight will be in St Louis Park, MN. We enjoy the giant screen movie **"Great American West,"** as well as the **Museum of Westward Expansion** where you will discover the land that Lewis & Clark explored. Listen as history unfolds through the voices of life-like "animatronic" figures.

Next you are treated to **lunch at Landry's Seafood House** in Union Station. You will have an opportunity to browse through

Saturday, Oct 9/Day 5 Altenburg, Wittenburg & Frohna, MO

We visit three German Lutheran communities today. In Altenburg, we are joined by a **step-on guide** to help us learn about the 1838-39 Lutheran immigration from Germany to America and the origins of the Lutheran Church in East Perry County. Here is where the Saxon Germans settled, and the home of our first synodical president, C.F.W. Walther.
